As many of you know, Weave has been working in Woolloomooloo since 2016 and it has been an absolute pleasure and a privilege to be part of this wonderful community. Through various community consultations and conversations, we have been actively asking individual community members and clients what they would like to see in the Woollo community and from Weave more specifically.

Many told us that there is a strong desire from the community to better support local young people and help them navigate complex issues and challenges they face.

Building on 45 years of Weave experience, our hope is that the Weave Community Hub will be a warm, safe and supportive youth friendly space, where young people from the local community can come and access support, and engage in projects and activities that empower them to change their lives.

We are now funded by the Department of Communities and Justice under the Targeted Earlier Intervention (TEI) Program, which means that our service delivery focus needs to be on casework support for children and young people, young parents and Aboriginal young people and families as well as some youth and community engagement activities.
